**I. INTRODUCTION & PROCEDURAL HISTORY**

On August 2, 2002, Citizens Communications Company, d/b/a Citizens Energy Services ("Citizens"), filed a petition ("Petition") with the Public Service Board ("Board") requesting approval for a rebate of \$5,152.71 from the Weatherization Trust Fund under the terms of 33 V.S.A. § 2503.

On November 7, 2002, a prehearing conference, via telephone, was held in this Docket. The parties agreed to negotiate toward a jointly stipulated agreement which would be submitted to the Board by November 13, 2002.

On November 8, 2002, a stipulation ("Stipulation") signed by the Vermont Department of Public Service ("DPS"), the Vermont State Office of Economic Opportunity ("SOEO"), and Citizens was filed with the Board. The parties to the Stipulation agree that the Board should approve a rebate to Citizens for expenditures in the amount of \$5,152.71. In addition, the parties waive their rights to a hearing and to comment on the Proposal for Decision pursuant to 3 V.S.A. § 811.

For the reasons discussed below, I recommend that the Board accept the parties' settlement and approve a rebate of \$5,152.71 from the Weatherization Trust Fund to Citizens.

I present the following Findings of Fact to the Board in accordance with 30 V.S.A. § 8.

**II. FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. On August 2, 2002, Citizens filed a Petition with the Board for approval of a fuel gross receipts tax rebate of \$5,152.71 pursuant to 33 V.S.A. § 2503(e). Petition at 1-2.

2. On November 13, 2002, a Stipulation was filed on behalf of the DPS, SOEO, and Citizens. The parties to the Stipulation agree that the Board may approve a rebate to Citizens for expenditures in the amount of \$5,152.71. Stipulation at 1.

3. Citizens' rebate request is to recover expenditures paid during the 2002 fiscal year (ending June 30, 2002). Petition at 1.

4. Citizens agrees to improve the coordination between itself, SOEO, and Efficiency Vermont in the coming year pursuant to the requirements described in paragraph three (3) of the Stipulation. Stipulation at 1-2.

5. Citizens' rebate request is for expenditures made pursuant to a negotiated "piggyback" agreement with SOEO, under which services are provided by Citizens through Champlain Valley Office of Economic Opportunity, Vermont Energy Investment Corporation, and Northeast Employment and Training Organization. Stipulation at 2.

6. The energy efficiency services were provided to low-income households as part of basic weatherization services following a comprehensive energy audit and workplan. Stipulation at 2.

7. Citizens agrees to work with SOEO and Efficiency Vermont to improve the penetration of services to low-income households and to ensure that those services are as comprehensive as possible. Stipulation at 1-2.

8. Citizens' expenditures of \$5,152.71 satisfy the statutory prerequisites for a tax rebate. Stipulation at 1-2.

### **III. DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSIONS**

The parties all agree that \$5,152.71 is the appropriate amount for a rebate from the Weatherization Trust Fund for Citizens' 2002 fiscal year expenditures. I recommend that the Board approve this settlement for the following reasons.

First, the Petition and Stipulation provide a description of the specific projects and measures installed that form the basis of Citizens' request. Verification of low-income status is indicated and measures were installed after comprehensive energy audits. These details provide significant assurance that statutory requirements have been met.

Second, the agreement was reached through negotiations with adverse parties. The DPS

represents the interests of ratepayers and the State of Vermont; it is, therefore, unlikely that the DPS would request that Citizens receive a larger rebate than it deserves. SOEO, and the community action agencies that contract with SOEO, are the direct beneficiaries of the Weatherization Trust Fund. It is unlikely that SOEO would request that Citizens receive a larger rebate than it deserves.

Thus, I conclude that Citizens has expended at least \$5,152.71 for the provision of energy efficiency services to low-income residents that "meet the goals of the weatherization program." 33 V.S.A. § 2503(e). I recommend that the Board accept the parties' stipulation and approve a rebate from the Weatherization Trust Fund for Citizens of \$5,152.71.
