AMENDED CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC GOOD ISSUED PURSUANT TO 30 V.S.A
SECTIONS 231 AND 503

On June 28, 1990, the Vermont Public Service Board ("Board"), Docket No. 5418, issued Harron Communications Corporation ("Harron") a Certificate of Public Good ("CPG") to provide cable television service in the Town of Wells and Pawlet, Vermont. On May 19, 1999, a joint Stipulation and Agreement was filed in the current docket by Harron, Adelpia Communications Corporation ("Adelpia"), and the Vermont Department of Public Service ("Department") (together, "Parties"). The purpose of the Stipulation and Agreement was to settle all issues related to the transfer by Harron of its issued and outstanding stock to Adelpia, which was approved by the Board in this docket. As part of the Stipulation and Agreement, the Parties requested that the Board amend Harron's CPG to incorporate certain conditions contained therein.

Harron's Certificate of Public Good is hereby amended to include the terms and conditions outlined below:

- a.. to incorporate conditions the Board imposes on the CPGs Adelpia's affiliates may receive in Docket No. 6101;
- b. to reflect the Docket No. 5883 settlement regarding filing of informational tariffs and amendments thereto in the form and manner prescribed by 30 V.S.A. § 225 and Board Rule 8.312;
- c. to state that Harron shall use the FCC annual rate adjustment method for

rate changes and will use the rate filing date of May for effect August;

d. to state that no fees for late payments shall be imposed on customers unless and until the Board permits Adelpia's affiliates to charge such fees; this provision is subject to any stays of the late fee decision in the Board's May 3, 1999 Order in Docket Nos. 6117, 6118, and 6119 or any successful appeal on the late fee issue by Adelpia of such order;

e. to reflect a line extension policy which allows for line extensions without customer contribution where there is an average density of 15 year-round residential units passed per mile, starting at the nearest end of the existing trunk or distribution system, or an average of 12 verified subscribers per mile along the proposed extension.
