**ORDER AMENDING CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC GOOD
TO REFLECT NAME CHANGE**

I. INTRODUCTION

On October 10, 1995, Allnet Communications, Inc. d/b/a Frontier Communications Services ("Allnet" or "the Company") received a Certificate of Public Good ("CPG") (CPG No. 204), pursuant to 30 V.S.A. § 231, to provide resold intrastate telecommunications services throughout Vermont. On November 24, 1999, Allnet filed a petition with the Board requesting that its CPG be amended to reflect a change in corporate name from Allnet to Global Crossing Telecommunications, Inc. ("Global"). The petition also noted that on December 27, 1996, Allnet had changed its name to Frontier Communications Services, Inc. ("Frontier") and registered the change with the Vermont Secretary of State's office. The Company's petition states that, as a result of administrative oversight on its part, it had failed to seek Board approval of this previous name change. Consequently, the Company requests the Board now amend its CPG to reflect the name change from Allnet to Frontier and thence to Global. As part of its petition, the Company also filed an amended certificate of authority on June 13, 2000, to conduct business in Vermont as a foreign corporation as Global.

On April 10, 2000, the Vermont Department of Public Service ("Department") filed a letter with the Board recommending that the Board approve the Company's request. The Department noted that the name changes do not appear to change the management structure, nor do they result in rate changes. Further, the Department recommended that the Board approve the petition without the need for hearings or investigation.

The Board, having reviewed the Company's petition and the other materials it filed,

agrees that an amended CPG should be issued. As a result, newspaper publication is not required prior to issuance of the amended CPG. 30 V.S.A. §§ 102(a), 231(a).

Based upon the Company's petition and accompanying documents, the Board makes the following findings.

II. FINDINGS

1. Allnet, a Michigan corporation, was issued a CPG to provide telecommunications services in Vermont on October 10, 1995. Petition at 1 and Exhibit 1.

2. As of June 13, 2000, the Company had received and filed with the Board all documents necessary to effect a corporate name change. Petition at 2, Exhibit 1 and correspondence from petitioner dated June 13, 2000.

3. The proposed name changes do not involve any change in ownership or the business practices of the Company, nor will they have any impact upon the services provided to the Company's customers. Petition at 2.

III. DISCUSSION

30 V.S.A. § 231(a) provides that the Board may amend or revoke any CPG for good cause, after hearing. Since there is no controversy surrounding the Company's name change, it follows that good cause exists to amend the Company's CPG to reflect the new name of the holder of the certificate. As for whether a hearing is necessary, we conclude that it is not. First, there is no genuine issue of material fact as to whether the Company's CPG should be amended and, consequently, under V.R.C.P. 56, a hearing is unnecessary. Second, the petitioner has asked that the CPG be amended, and the DPS has recommended that the petition be approved without hearing. Finally, 30 V.S.A. § 231(a) requires only the opportunity for a hearing, thus acknowledging that a hearing is not always necessary prior to amendment.

IV. CONCLUSIONS

1. The CPG held by Allnet Communication Services, Inc. should be amended to reflect the Company's interim name change to Frontier Communications Services, Inc., and thence to the new name the of the holder of the certificate: Global Crossing Telecommunications, Inc. 30 V.S.A. § 231.

2. The Company should file an amended tariff with the Board that reflects the Company's new name, within 30 days of issuance of its amended CPG.

V. ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Public Service Board of the State of Vermont that:

1. The Certificate of Public Good that was issued to Allnet Communication Services, Inc. d/b/a Frontier Communications Services, on October 10, 1995, shall be amended to reflect the Company's interim name change to Frontier Communications Services, Inc., and thence to the new name the of the holder of the certificate: Global Crossing Telecommunications, Inc.

2. The Company shall file an amended tariff with the Board that reflects the Company's new name, within 30 days of issuance of its amended CPG.
